

## LDF Campground and Tribal Landing Boat Launch Policy and Procedures

- 1. All access (unless an enrolled member of the Lac du Flambeau Tribe) to the Lac du Flambeau Campground Boat Launch requires a launch pass that can be purchased in person at the campground office, the Ojibwe Market, or Natural Resources. Tribal boat landings that require a pass can also be purchased at the locations listed above.
- 2. Those wishing to purchase a pass can do either as a 3 day pass which is \$25, or as a seasonal pass which is \$60. Business passes need to be purchased separate from personal use (Dock Installers, Guides, Rental Companies, etc.). Businesses must purchase a onetime pass for the season for \$350. Residential season passes can be purchased for \$40 as long as they show proof of residency in Lac du Flambeau.
- 3. 3 Day passes will expire three days from the date indicated on the pass provided to the customer. Seasonal passes are honored until the season's close and will have a pass that specifically indicates it is a seasonal pass.
- 4. When applying for a pass, we will require the name of purchasing party, address, license plate number, and date at the time of application.
- 5. After receiving all the proper information and payment, the campground staff will log all the data into our tracking system to ensure that the information on file reflects accordingly. Once complete, a permit will be issued to the customer based on what was selected and paid for.
- 6. Lac du Flambeau Campground and Tribal Boat launches will be continuously monitored by surveillance. Access gained to the boat launch without a proper permit may result in a fine and/or ticket.


Those currently camping with the Lac du Flambeau Campground and Marina will not be required to pay a ramp fee for the campground landing only.

WHEREAS, the Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians ("Tribe"), is a federally recognized Indian tribe organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, 25 U.S.C. §5101 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III, Section 1 of the Lac du Flambeau Constitution ("Constitution"), the governing body of the Tribe is the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution at Article VI, Section 1 (a) vest the Tribe Council with the power and duty "to protect the health, security, and general welfare of the Tribe"; and

WHEREAS, the Tribat Council wishes to implement a Permit Process for Tribat Boat Landings on Tribat Land; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by this Council, in Regular Session assembled, hereby approves the temporary closure of Tribal Boat Landings on Tribal Lands to non-members until a Permit Process is in place (see attached list).

## CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Secretary of the Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, a tribal government operating under a Constitution adopted pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act, 25 U.S.C. §5123, do hereby certify that the Tribal Council of the Band is composed of twelve members, of whom ten constituting a quorum, were present at a Regular Meeting, duly called, noticed, converied, and held on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Day of January, 2023, and that the foregoing resolution was duly adopted at said meeting by an affirmative vote of nine members (R.
